| Setting: | A large room with a dinner table with food in <i>Lazarus</i> 's house. (The communion table could serve the purpose.) <i>Martha</i> has no lines but serves people food from the table. Lots of people (<i>Crowd</i>) milling around and chatting with each other. <i>Judas</i> leans against the wall on one side. <i>Jesus</i> is seated toward center on the other side. <i>Mary</i> will enter past <i>Judas</i> and cross to <i>Jesus</i> . The <i>Narrator</i> may be apart from the scene or one of the <i>Crowd</i> . |

| Narrator: | Six days before the Passover celebration began, Jesus arrived in Bethany, the home of Lazarus— |
| Lazarus: | [waves cheerily to congregation, breaking 4th wall] – the man he had raised from the dead! |
| Narrator: | A dinner was prepared in Jesus' honor. Martha served, and Lazarus was among those who ate with him. |
| | [All stop what they are doing to watch Mary] |
| Mary: | [<i>Acting out as she says</i>] Then Mary took a twelve-ounce jar of expensive perfume made from essence of nard, and she anointed Jesus' feet with it, wiping his feet with her hair. |
| Crowd: | The house was filled with the fragrance! |
| Narrator: | But Judas Iscariot, the disciple who would soon betray him, said, |
| Judas: | That perfume was worth a year's wages. It should have been sold and the money given to the poor. |
| Narrator: | Not that he cared for the poor—he was a thief, and since he was in charge of the disciples' money, he often stole some for himself. But Jesus said, |
| Jesus: | Leave her alone. She did this in preparation for my burial. You will always have the poor among you, but you will not always have me. |
