Jesus Heals a Centurion's Servant

7 After Jesus had finished all his sayings in the hearing of the people, he entered Capernaum.

2 A centurion there had a slave whom he valued highly, and who was ill and close to death. 3 When he heard about Jesus, he sent some Jewish elders to him, asking him to come and heal his slave. 4 When they came to Jesus, they appealed to him earnestly, saying, "He is worthy of having you do this for him, 5 for he loves our people, and it is he who built our synagogue for us."

6 And Jesus went with them, but when he was not far from the house, the centurion sent friends to say to him, "Lord, do not trouble yourself, for I am not worthy to have you <u>come</u> under my roof; 7 therefore I did not presume to <u>come</u> to you. But only <u>speak the word</u>, and let my servant be healed. 8 For I also am a man you under authority, with soldiers under me; and I say to one, 'Go,' and he goes, and to another, 'Come,' and he <u>comes</u>, and to my slave, 'Do this,' and the slave does it."

9 When Jesus heard this he was amazed at him, and turning to the crowd that followed him, he said, "I tell you, not even in Israel have I found such faith." 10 When those who had been sent returned to the house, they found the slave in good health.

Jesus' amazement = thaumazo Used to describe other's response <i>to him</i> usually! (And the same word Paul uses in the Galatian passage. Here, the amazement has a positive spin.)	For the prayers of the people, divide the congregation up into smaller groups. If you have a prayer list, direct people to pray with the confidence of the centurion for those listed. You may also ask for spontaneous requests before you begin, or have spontaneous requests gathered in the small groups. Whichever way you do this, emphasize the prayers are to be offered with the expectation that they will be heard and responded to - a la the centurion's expectation. <i>Yoda - DO! Or Do not.</i> <i>There is no "try."</i> What characteristics do you vouch for? What would lead you to speak well for and speak up on behalf of someone?
