Text: Romans 13:8-14

8 **Owe no one anything**, except **to love one another**; for **the one who loves another** has **fulfilled the law**. 9 The commandments, “You shall not commit adultery; You shall not murder; You shall not steal; You shall not covet”; and any other commandment, are summed up in this word, “**Love your neighbor as yourself.**” 10 **Love does no wrong to a neighbor**; **therefore, love is the fulfilling of the law.**

11 Besides this, you know what time it is, how **it is now the moment for you to wake from sleep**. For **salvation is nearer to us now** than when we became believers; 12 **the night is far gone, the day is near**. Let us then lay aside the works of **darkness** and **put on the armor of light**; 13 **let us live honorably** as in the day, **not in reveling and drunkenness, not in debauchery and licentiousness, not in quarreling and jealousy**. 14 Instead, **put on the Lord Jesus Christ**, and **make no provision for the flesh**, to gratify its desires.
