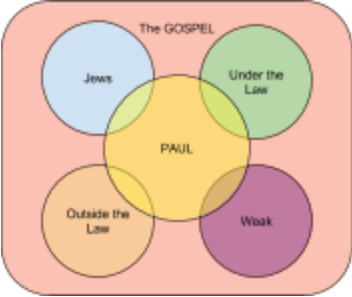
Text: 1 Corinthians 9:16-23

16 **If I proclaim the gospel**, this gives me **no ground for boasting**, for **an obligation is laid on me**, and woe to me if I do not **proclaim the gospel!** 17 For **if I do this of my own will**, I have a reward; but **if not of my own will**, **I am entrusted with a commission**. 18 What then is my reward? Just this: that in **my proclamation** I may make the gospel free of charge, so as not to make full use of my rights in the gospel.

19 For though **I am free with respect to all**, **I have made myself a slave to all**, so that I might win more of them. 20 To the Jews **I became as a Jew, in order to win Jews**. To those under the law **I became as one under the law** (though I myself am not under the law) **so that I might win those under the law**. 21 To those outside the law **I became as one outside the law** (though I am not free from God's law but am under Christ's law) **so that I might win those outside the law**. 22 To the weak **I became weak**, **so that I might win the weak**. **I have become all things to all people**, that I might by all means save some. 23 I do it all for the sake of the gospel, so that I may share in its blessings.

<p>Math - Logical/Mathematical</p> <p>D2</p>		<p>For Paul, the goal is not to acquire power, but to lay it down.</p> <p>We could compare this to a chemical reaction that requires some atoms to give up electrons in order to bond with others.</p>	<p>Sounds like it's time for a <a href="#">Venn Diagram</a>! Show the different groups Paul refers to, and then overlap them with Paul, and then with the Gospel</p> 
<p>Body - Kinesthetic</p> <p>MWD</p>		<p>“To the weak I became weak, that I might win the weak.’ No one in the Roman world strives to appear weak. Weakness is not a virtue.”</p> <p>~ <a href="#">Carla Works</a>, WP</p> <p>Much like those old Charles Atlas <a href="#">advertisements</a>! Here's <a href="#">more</a>. (Not sure I'd recommend his conflict resolution strategy, but who am I?)</p>	
<p>Musical</p>		<p>vs . 20-21</p> <p>The “all things” is a repetition of two things in an A-A-B-B pattern.</p>	
<p>Natural</p> <p>MWD</p>		<p>Vs 19-22</p> <p>Paul is acting like a chameleon, <a href="#">or is he?</a></p> <p>In each case, he chooses to enter the world of each group mentioned for the sake of the gospel.</p>	

<p>People - Interpersonal</p> <p>D2</p>		<p>Paul’s apostolic ministry was perhaps not unlike being a traveling sales rep. <a href="#">Here’s an interview with one such</a>. The key is to build relationships and connect with your client’s needs and motivations. (I wonder what the donkey guy’s motivation was.... Read the interview.)</p> <p>In the movie <i>Invasion of the Body Snatchers</i> (<a href="#">1956 / 1978</a>), aliens plan to take over our planet by taking on our physical form. They can then walk among us, assimilating or replacing people without anyone knowing it until it’s too late. Maybe this is Paul’s / God’s plan for reclaiming Earth from the principalities and powers</p>	
<p>Self - Intrapersonal</p>		<p>“Paul remembers the God who sought him and the people who showed him -- not just told him -- that God was seeking him, and, most importantly, was seeking him along with seeking everyone else on the planet. Paul understood that God’s desire to be in relationship with him was “about him,” but not only about him.” ~ <a href="#">Frank Crouch</a>, WP</p>	<p>“To become weak—not simply to appear weak—is to adopt a cruciform pattern of existence.”</p> <p>Also: “Boasting is one way that we try to overcome the limits the world sets for us.
