

More Than Hearing Worksheet

Episode: BOrd4x2018

Text: Mark 1:21-28

21 They **went to Capernaum**; and when the sabbath came, **he entered** the synagogue and taught. 22 They were **astounded** at **his teaching**, for **he taught** them as **one having authority**, and not as the scribes. 23 Just then there was in their synagogue **a man with an unclean spirit**, 24 and **he cried out**, “What have you to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth? Have you come to destroy us? I know who you are, the Holy One of God.” 25 But Jesus rebuked him, saying, “**Be silent**, and come out of him!” 26 And the **unclean spirit**, **convulsing him** and **crying with a loud voice**, came out of him. 27 They were all **amazed**, and they kept on asking one another, “What is this? A new teaching—with authority! He commands even the unclean spirits, and they obey him.” 28 At once **his fame began to spread throughout the surrounding region of Galilee**.

Word - Verbal/Linguistic	Vs. 25 - rebuke = <i>epitimaō</i> which means “honor”. Mark Davis : “However, I will be wondering this week about how a word can mean both “to honor” or “to censure.” For example, must Jesus recognize the unclean spirit as a genuine force and take it seriously before commanding it to be silent and to exit?”	The verbs are present or imperfect tense = movement and continuous action. The man switches back and forth between plural and singular pronouns, so how many unclean spirits are present?	Have people raise their hands whenever a verb is read. One hand for singular, two hands for plural.
Eye - Visual/Spatial	This is one of Mark’s “sandwich” passages - questions/comments about authority with an exorcism stuck in between!	There is an unclean spirit present in the sanctuary. At the hours of 3-4pm in the winter, the sun shines through my kitchen windows and reveals how dirty it is. I can see all the dust, crumbs, and dog hair under the edges of the counters and sticking out from under the fridge.	← make that sandwich!

Math - Logical/Mathematical MWD		<p>Mark's sandwich technique is a simple structure, much like an American Foursquare house.</p> <p>"The boxy shape provides a maximum amount of interior room space, to use a small city lot to best advantage."</p>	<p>Build a foursquare house out of Lincoln logs or Legos.</p> <p>The outer walls are the question of "authority" and the exorcism is the interior which demonstrates Jesus' authority dramatically.</p>
