Text 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1

13 But just as **we have the same spirit of faith** that is **in accordance with scripture**—“**I believed, and so I spoke**” —we also **believe**, and so we **speak**, 14 because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus will raise us also with Jesus, and will bring us with you into his presence. 15 Yes, everything is for your sake, so that grace, as it extends to more and more people, may increase **thanksgiving**, to the glory of God.

16 So **we do not lose heart**. Even though **our outer nature** is wasting away, **our inner nature** is being renewed day by day. 17 For this slight momentary affliction is preparing us for an eternal weight of glory **beyond all measure**, 18 because **we look not at what can be seen but at what cannot be seen**; for **what can be seen** is temporary, but **what cannot be seen** is eternal.

5 For we know that if **the earthly tent we live in** is destroyed, we have a building from God, a house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.
