Eye - Visual/Spatial		<p>*(per Taize commentary) Paul has found that joy comes “from communion with the risen Christ, who has already passed through the lowest point of the human condition” ^ like riding a roller coaster a second time: you know the track and put up with going up the big hill for the thrill of diving down into the dip. This is the reverse. Because Paul knows the track from Jesus’ death and resurrection he can put up with the dip for the thrill of rising up!</p>
