This reading arranged for interpretive movement is imagined with one person reading and two others performing the movements. While the mood of the piece is rather dire in places, the movements, many of which are pantomime, are intended to be somewhat lighthearted and caricatured. At least that's the idea as I'm sitting down to write them. There will need to be some noticeable pauses between some of these micro-vignettes to allow for resetting the scene, as it were.

29 By faith the people passed through the Red Sea as if it were dry land,	Walking across chancel, one as if something (like the Red Sea) is going to drop on her head at any moment, the other striding confidently and passing the first.
but when the Egyptians attempted to do so they were drowned.	One starts to charge back across, as carrying a spear overhead. The other overtakes him, tackling him to the ground from above.
30 By faith the walls of Jericho fell after they had been encircled for seven days.	The two face each other, 10 feet apart, with hands over head. They are the walls. Slowly, they fold at the waste, collapsing to the "ground", standing but bent 90 degrees at the waste.
31 By faith Rahab the prostitute did not perish with those who were disobedient, because she had received the spies in peace.	"Rahab" greets the "spy" with a kiss on each cheek, and then covertly, casually, hustles the spy "out" so no one will notice, then stands and "looks innocent"
